






Church Membership Class: If you are interested in becoming a member of our church, there will be a membership class in Room 205. Please sign up in The







Scholarship Fund

Were you aware that the church has a Scholarship Fund? The following is some information:

Qualifications

- Applicant must testify to SCHOLARSHIP the fact that he or she has had a personal experience of salvation.
- Applicant must be active in the life of the Shippensburg First Church of God.
- Applicant must be a full-time student in a curriculum leading to full-time Christian service.
- Applicant must maintain a 2.5 Grade Point Average and submit the appropriate document to show the academic standing.
- Applicant must apply every year and may not qualify for scholarship for more than four years.
- Applicant must be planning to enter full-time Christian service after graduation.

Application process

- Scholarship application will be processed only after the applicant submits the completed application to the Scholarship Trust Fund Committee by June 15.
- Applicant should be available to meet with Scholarship Trust Fund Committee for an interview between June 15 and August 1.
- Scholarship Trust Fund Committee will present to Christian Education Committee recommendations for scholarship recipient(s).
- † The Christian Education Committee will then review the recommendations and make the final decision.
- Each scholarship recipient will be awarded up to \$800 depending on the availability of funds.
- An additional award is available for Church members. This amount will be determined by CEC.
- Scholarship recipient(s) will be notified of decision by August 15.
- New application must be submitted for each year the applicant desires to be considered for scholarship.

If the scholarship recipient is not in full-time Christian ministry after graduation, we encourage them to donate to the Scholarship Fund supporting future scholarship recipients.



Recipe—Yum-Yum Pudding

60 Ritz crackers, crushed into crumbs

1/4 lb. butter, melted 2 sm. pkgs instant pudding 1½ cups milk

- 2 quarts vanilla ice cream, softened
- 1 (9 oz.) ctn. Cool Whip, thawed

Mix together cracker crumbs and butter to form a crust. Spread into a 9x13" cake pan. Mix milk and pudding until thick. Add ice cream into pudding mixture. Spread over top of cracker crust. Refrigerate at least 1 hour before serving. Spread Cool Whip on top before serving.
