Scholarship Fund

Were you aware that the church has a Scholarship Fund? The following is some information:

Qualifications

- Applicant must testify to the fact that he or she has had a personal experience of salvation.
- Applicant must be active in the life of the Shippensburg First Church of God.
- Applicant must be a full-time student in a curriculum leading to full-time Christian service.
- Applicant must maintain a 2.5 Grade Point Average and submit the appropriate document to show the academic standing.

- Applicant must apply every year and may not qualify for scholarship for more than four years.
- Applicant must be planning to enter fulltime Christian service after graduation.

Application process

- Scholarship application will be processed only after the applicant submits the completed application to the Scholarship Trust Fund Committee by June 15.
- Applicant should be available to meet with Cookies Needed Scholarship Trust Fund Committee for an Sign Up to Bake Cookies interview between June 15 and August 1.

Needed

Recipe—Coconut Cream Pie

- 1 baked pie crust
- 2 cups milk
- ¹/₄ cup butter
- ³/₄ cup sugar ¹/₄ cornstarch
- eggs, separated tsp. vanilla
- cup coconut

 $\frac{1}{2}$ salt

Pre-heat oven to 350°F. Combine sugar, cornstarch, and salt. Add the beaten egg yolks and vanilla. Put milk and butter in a 2-quart saucepan. Add the egg yolks and sugar mixture. Cook over medium heat till thick, stirring constantly. Add coconut and stir till well blended. Pour into baked pie crust and cover with meringue. Sprinkle coconut over the meringue and bake till golden brown.

Doorposts

The image of a doorframe marked with blood comes from the Old Testament Passover account, when the Israelites prepared to flee slavery in Egypt. God directed them to slaughter lambs for a final meal and paint their doorposts with the blood. God sent the Angel of Death to kill the firstborn sons of Egypt, but the blood on the Israelites' doorposts served as a signal that the Destroyer should "pass over" those homes. Likewise, the blood of Jesus, the Lamb of God, saves us from eternal death.
