Scholarship Fund

Were you aware that the church has a Scholarship Fund? The following is some information:

Qualifications

- Applicant must testify to the fact that he or she has had a personal experience of salvation.
- Applicant must be active in the life of the Shippensburg First Church of God.
- Applicant must be a full-time student in a curriculum leading to full-time Christian service.
- Applicant must maintain a 2.5 Grade Point Average and submit the appropriate document to show the academic standing.
- Applicant must apply every year and may not qualify for scholarship for more than four years.
- Applicant must be planning to enter full-time
 Christian service after graduation.

Application process

Scholarship application will be processed only after the applicant submits the completed application to the Scholarship Trust Fund Committee by June 15.



LIVE

- Applicant should be available to meet with Scholarship Trust Fund Committee for an interview between June 15 and August 1.
- Scholarship Trust Fund Committee will present to Christian Education Committee
- recommendations for scholarship recipient(s). The Christian Education Committee will then review the recommendations and make the final decision.

Each scholarship recipient will be awarded up to \$800 depending on the availability of funds. An additional award is available for Church members. This amount will be determined by CEC.

- Scholarship recipient(s) will be notified of decision by August 15.
- New application must be submitted for each year the applicant desires to be considered for scholarship.

5 If the scholarship recipient is not in full-time Christian f ministry after graduation, we encourage them to donate to the Scholarship Fund supporting future scholarship recipients.

-Lavered Beef 'n Potatoes

- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1 (8 oz.) can tomato
- sauce 1 (12 oz.) can
- Mexicorn, drained
- 2 tbsp. chopped
- onion
- 1 tsp. salt
- Dash of pepper 1¹/₂ c. dried mashed potato flakes $1\frac{1}{2}$ c. sour cream $\frac{1}{3}$ c. water 1¹/₂ c. grated American cheese

In a skillet, brown ground beef and drain well. Place in crock pot and add tomato sauce, corn, onion, salt and pepper. Mix well. In a bowl, mix potato flakes with sour cream and water. Spread potato mixture over beef. Top with grated cheese. Cover and cook on low setting for 7-10 hours. Makes 4 servings.





Lily The lily that Solooms around Easter is a symbol Christ's



resurrection because it rises from a seemingly lifeless bulb decaying in the ground. If is also used as a symbol of Christ himself. The lily, a symbol of purity, is often used to represent the Virgin ES Marv.

Paschal Candle

This large, white candle is an ancient symbol for Christ, the light of the world. The candle contains a cross and/or an Alpha and Omega to symbolize that Jesus is eternal and always present with his people. Also called the Easter candle, it plays a prominent role

during Easter vigils and celebrations. Some churches also use the candle during baptisms and funerals.



SLoosed From Death

Almost 100 years ago, onetime U.K. poet laureate John Masefield wrote a play called *The Trial of*

Jesus. In it, the centurion who oversaw Jesus' execution returns to give Pontius Pilate an official report. When Pilate's wife requests and receives details about the crucifixion, she asks, Do you think he is dead? Despite what he shad witnessed, the centurion answers, No, lady, We don't.


